434 randomly selected Upper Valley residents
Telephone interviews conducted November 19 to 30, 2012
Margin of error is 4.9%


Survey Topics








Length of residency





Where do respondents live?




How would you rate the overall quality of life in the part of Vermont/New Hampshire where you live?



When asked what they like LEAST about living in this area, respondents were most likely to answer "the weather" (17%) followed by "I don't know" (14%) or "nothing" (13%).



Country living




We must invest in land conservation to protect the Upper Valley's quality of life for future generations.






Some of our forests and farm lands are being lost to development and we should take steps to preserve them before they are lost forever.






Protecting land, water and wildlife in the Upper Valley is critical to our economy and helps area businesses.






Protecting land as open space takes land off the tax rolls and prevents residential and commercial development, which could raise property taxes for the rest of us.






Legislators have to make hard choices in these tough times and we just can't afford to pay for land conservation right now.






How familiar would you say you are with land conservation?






How important do you think land conservation can be in maintaining the quality of life in a region?






Would you vote for a proposal that would conserve open space in your town?

Information Sources

42% The Valley News is primary (28%) or secondary (15%) local news source.

27% WMUR (Channel 9) is primary (19%) or secondary (8%) news source. Residents of southern NH quadrant most likely.

11% internet is primary or secondary source
More than double from 2006

11% local cable is primary or secondary source



Information Sources

74% of respondents have home email accounts (was 64% in 2006)

25% of respondents are members of a local list serve that provides information about town government and town events by email

(was 7% in 2006)
