Integrity

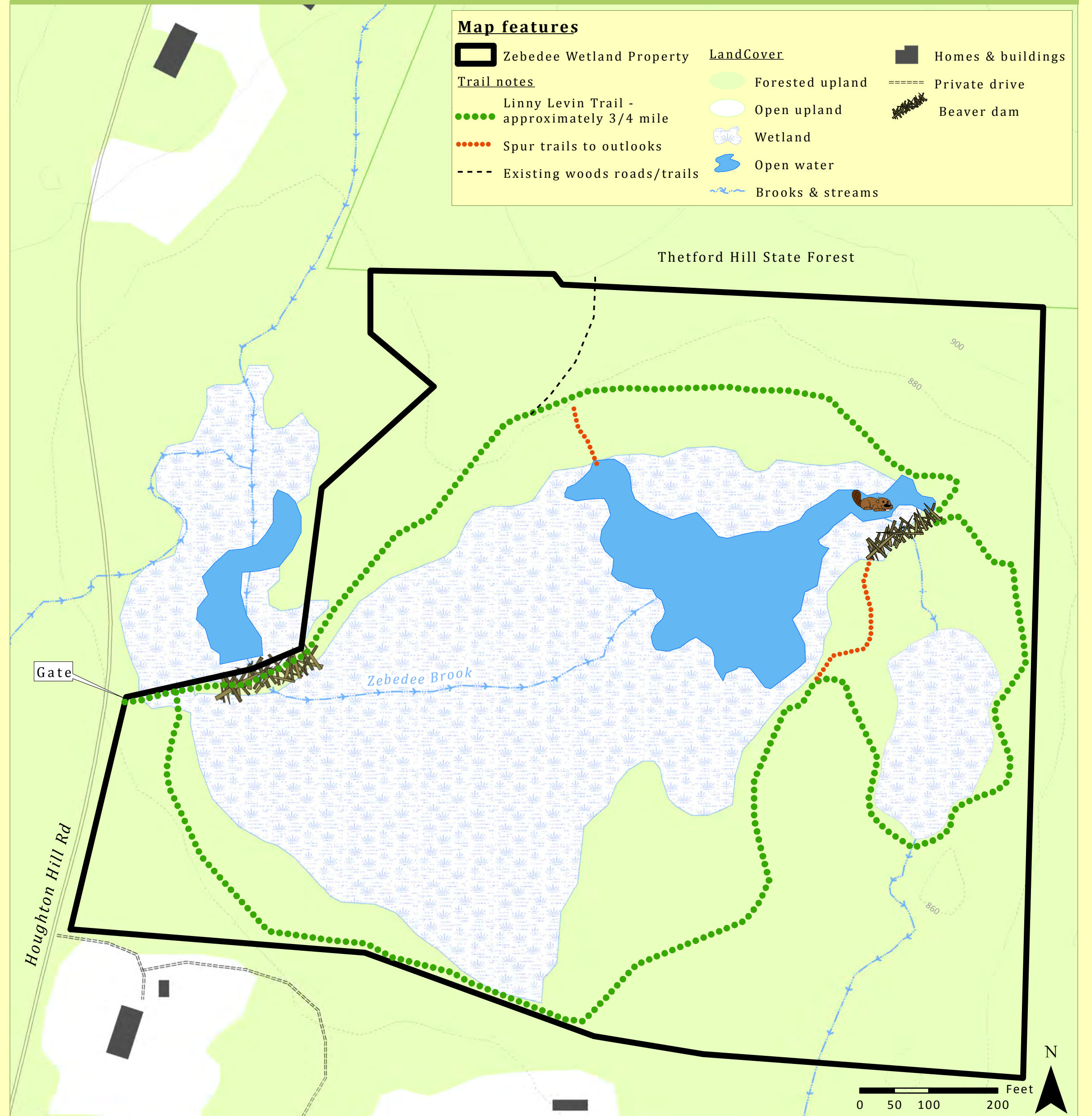
Ecological Integrity, that is. As landowner, UVLT is working to restore Zebedee to an intact & productive wetland. With the removal of an existing man-made dam in 2010, and the steady influence of the king of "keystone species," the beaver, the wetland hydrology has been restored and the wetland ecosystem has returned to a dynamic natural state. Waterfowl, reptiles, amphibians, and the freshwater wetland communities have all benefited.
