Upper Valley Land Trust 2019 Patchen Miller Internship Application Guidelines

The Patchen Miller Internship at UVLT embraces the science, stewardship and sense of community involved in land conservation. A Patchen Miller intern has the opportunity to work in the conservation field while gaining valuable experience with a nonprofit organization. The goal of the internship is to match an intern's individual interests and learning objectives while furthering UVLT's mission and strategic objectives in collaboration with naturalists and professional mentors. Internship length is variable but should incorporate approximately 200-220 hours of work. A modest stipend of \$1800-\$2000 will be awarded depending on hours worked.

The 2019 internship will be oriented toward conservation easement stewardship. The intern will work in conjunction with staff to visit, inspect and document UVLT conservation easements in the 45-town service area. The internship will include training and supervision by staff and requires a commitment to undertake and complete tasks independently including both field and office work.

Internship responsibilities will include:

- Field visits to conserved properties scheduled for monitoring in summer 2019;
- The collection of data and information necessary to complete Monitoring Inspection Reports (MIRs) including, for example, changes to natural and human-made features / conditions found on subject properties (ex. water resources, forest conditions, agricultural practices, boundary monumentation, etc.);
- The use of a GPS receiver and the ability to navigate using a map and compass;
- The creation of monitoring reports and related materials including digital photographs, a boundary condition report, and maps generated using GPS.

Preference will be given to candidates with the following experience, skills, and abilities:

- An interest and/or course work in natural resource management and/or environmental studies;
- A working knowledge of GPS and GIS;
- The ability to work independently in an outdoor setting that may include forests and agricultural lands found on variable terrain in variable weather conditions.

Note: independent travel to subject properties in the UVLT service area is required. Mileage reimbursement will be available with appropriate documentation.

Your application should include your resume and a brief letter outlining your interests and any relevant skills and/or work experience. If you are selected, UVLT staff will work closely with you to develop a plan to meet both your objectives and UVLT's project goals.
